

Integrated Math 2H Syllabus Mr. Denny 2022-2023

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Welcome to Integrated Math 1! I hope that you find this course to be beneficial, challenging, and engaging.

Grading:

Homework:

Homework will be given on Deltamath.com as well as in the book and via other resources. Students are expected to maintain a Deltamath account and to let me know immediately if they have any issues accessing their account or if need me to reset their password. The score given on a homework assignment will be a direct reflection of the number of questions completed correctly on Deltamath. Students have unlimited opportunities to keep trying problems until they can get them correct, so it is hoped that all students will receive full points on each of these assignments. Reminders for these assignments will be posted on the Google Classroom, but the actual assignment is to be done on the Deltamath website. To receive full credit, assignments must be turned in on time. Half credit will be given to homework submitted late but before the corresponding test. No credit will be given to homework submitted after the test.

Make Up Work:

Students will be given 1 extra days for every **excused** day they were absent to turn in make-up work. It is the responsibility of the student to get the make-up work. If a test or quiz is missed, that test or quiz will be made up the day the student returns. Accommodations may be made on an individual level for extended, excused absences. Missing tests/quizzes will be entered in the gradebook as zeros until the time at which they are made up. It is the responsibility of the student to initiate making up any missed tests or quizzes. Test and quiz days will be given well in

advance, so missing the day before a test or quiz is not an excuse to postpone the test or quiz. Again, extended excused absences (more than 2 days) will be dealt with individually.

Test Redos:

With the exception of legal accommodations, there will be no redos of tests or quizzes.

Recommended Materials:

It is encouraged for students to show up with a sharpened pencil and a scientific calculator (not a phone calculator).* They are also expected to bring their Chromebooks daily.

Academic Honesty:

If a student is known to have cheated on a test or a quiz a zero will be issued without the opportunity for make-up.

For the purposes of this rule, cheating will be defined to include the following:

- 1. Intentionally accessing or distributing material revealing contents of or solutions to assessments.
- 2. Accessing or possessing devices which could give a student an unfair advantage on a test. During all tests and quizzes students will be told to put phones out of sight and out of reach. Students checking their phones or failing to keep their phones out of sight during a test will be considered to be cheating, regardless of what they have accessed on their phone.
- 3. Any information written on a student's body that is related to the material on a test or quiz.
- 4. Any other method by which a student may try to gain an unfair advantage on a test or quiz.

Rules and Expectations:

- 1. Students will be in their correct seat from before the bell rings until they are dismissed, unless directed otherwise.
- 2. Students will be active participants in their own education by:
 - a. Listening respectfully
 - b. Asking detailed questions
 - c. Being ready to respond when called on
- 3. Cell phones, earphones, and all other electronics are to be kept out of sight unless otherwise noted.
- 4. Food and gum are to be kept away.

Progressive Discipline:

If a student chooses, after being reminded, not to adhere to these rules, they will face the following sequential consequences**:

Detention with Mr. Denny. This will be 15 minutes during lunch or after school and students will be given two days to complete the detention. Failing to complete this detention will cause the detention to escalate to a school-based detention.

1. Email to parent/guardian.

- 2. Email to parent/guardian/counselor.
- School-based detention.
- 4. Parent-teacher conference requested
- 5. Sent out of class

If a phone is distracting a student, after a warning I will hold on to the phone for the duration of the period to help the student focus. Earphones/Earbuds/Airpods are not to be worn unless there is an opportunity for independent work. Because of the ease in concealing these and amount they can hinder learning, if these are being used during class they are grounds for a school-based detention.
